SASHIKO

Alice Per and I are doing a Sashiko Workshop -for once on a Tuesday- in October. There are two sessions, the 3^{rd,} and the 17th, and those doing the workshop are free to come to one or both. We have also prepared a number of kits for those who don't want to do the workshop but want to do the stitching.

Sashiko is a type of traditional Japanese embroidery or stitching initially used for functional reinforcement of cloth and clothing but now used decoratively as well. Sashiko literally means 'little stabs' and refers to the manner of stitching. It is beautifully simple and also complex, and very satisfying. It feeds well into the new ethic of repairing and reusing, which we embroiderers are well suited to.

Initially Sashiko was a way to make prized cloth last longer, the stitching reinforced the cloth in areas where it became most commonly worn out, or where repairs were necessary. While the traditionally work is white thread on blue fabric, it has evolved to include work of many colours, and many forms of design.

At the workshop we are making coasters, which is a lovely way of using up small pieces of fabric. But very large and beautiful decorative pieces are also made.
