WORKSHOP COSTS

The costs to the guild of running workshops is increasing, as is everything else, sadly. We try to keep them to a minimum, and our teachers do not get paid. Despite using as much of the stash which we have to make up the workshop kits, most workshops run at a loss, or just about break even. We can't keep doing that. We will be calculating the cost of each workshop as they come up, and will let you know beforehand, what they will be. The minimum cost in 2024 will be R50 but will increase should the kit costs exceed that. When you think about what you get, it's still an incredible bargain.
