This month we are featuring Tumelo Sihlabela, who works for the Rand Gym but is always available to help in all sorts of ways. It is a privilege to be able to bring you his story.



Tumelo Sihlabela was born on the 15^{th of} May 1994, in Nelspruit, Mpumalanga. His mother died when he was very young, and he never knew his father. After spending his early years with his mother's family, not in the specific care of anyone, he came to Johannesburg in 2002, when he was 8, to live with his auntie. However, things were very bad for him there, he was maltreated, starved, and abused by his aunt. Within two years he ran away to live on the streets. One of the many homeless children we see every day, He lived by his wits until 2011, when he was found and helped by Turning Point, a children's home in Brixton. There he managed to reach Grade 10 and was sent by them to WestRand College, where he completed a bricklaying course. He worked for a while for a company called Bupilong, mending roads for 6 months, before getting a job at Rand Gymnastics, at the Roosevelt Park Recreation Centre, again through Turning Point.

Tumelo, as we all know, helps out whenever he can, at the centre, and is unfailingly cheerful and polite. He says he loves working at the centre and being able to help. He lives by himself, in Dobsonville, Soweto where his son, Themba, who is 7 and lives in Ellis Park with his maternal grandmother, visits during school holidays. While he doesn't have a partner at the moment, he does intend to marry one day, when he has found the right person.

In his spare time, he loves watching series and shows on Showmax, his favourite one being The Wife. He is also learning how to write a business plan as his dream is to open a laundry in Soweto. He is saving all he can to buy a washing machine, to start this business.

Tumelo is an inspirational young man, and one whom we are all proud to know.
